Our Response to AB109: Organizational & Procurement Changes

- Post Release Division Created:
 - Supervision units established at 6 sites in the County to provide proactive community supervision
- Expanded contracts with mental health and substance abuse providers
 - Alcohol & Drug Treatment : 6 outpatient & 10 residential
 - Mental Health Treatment : 6 outpatient & 1 full service partnership
- Use of COMPAS risk/needs assessment to guide service procurement for population's rehabilitation needs

Our Response to AB109: New Programs & Services

- Behavioral Health Screening Team: Immediate screening and linkage to treatment services
- Community Transition Center (CTC)
 - Assessments administered, a case plan developed and linkages to re-entry services provided
 - Transitional housing and onsite detoxification services
- Community Resource Directory (CRD)
 - Referral and tracking of offenders' mental and behavioral health needs
 - Measurement of offender progress and engagement by officer
- Reentry Court
- Work Furlough & Residential Reentry
- Work Release & Work Projects

Outcomes: Supervision

- 398 individuals received a 6-month early discharge
- 157 individuals discharged at 1 year/no custodial violations
- 1,098 Flash incarcerations of 1,019 individuals
- 482 Revocation Petitions filed
- Approximately 24% charged with new criminal cases (as of September 30, 2012)

Outcomes:

Mental Health & Alcohol and Drug Services

- **Behavioral Health Services**
 - Referred: 1,434 individuals; Admitted: 979 individuals
- **Mental Health Services (27% of All Admissions)**
 - *Basic Medication (29%)*: Medication evaluation & management
 - *Enhanced Recovery (55%)*: Counseling & rehabilitation services as well as medication evaluation and management
 - *Full Service Partnership (16%)*: Intensive services for the extremely disabled
- **Alcohol and Drug Services (73% of All Admissions)**
 - *Outpatient/Day Treatment (36%)*: Up to 15 hours/week of individual and group counseling
 - *Residential Treatment (51%)*: Treatment for severe addictive disorders
 - *Detoxification (13%)*

Looking Ahead: Future Plans

- Leveraging Collaborative Justice Principles: Mandatory Supervision Offenders
 - Case plan at sentencing
 - In custody services
 - Pre-release court hearing
 - Proactive supervision in the community
 - Regular status hearings with the Court
 - Incentive based supervision step-down
